The Art Hotel and the Galleria Umberto

The boutique Art Hotel is located in the fabulous Galleria
Umberto, one of Naples must see destinations and should you decide to stay here it's position is the perfect location with easy access to all of the city's major attractions.

It is reached by a small ornate iron lift which takes you to the 4 th floor. The interior evokes an extraordinary sense of luxury with its incredible frescoed ceilings, ornate gilded furniture, elaborate brocades and marble bathrooms. It perfectly compliments the historic Victorian Galleria and its balconies open either onto the amazing interior of the soaring mall or onto

views of Naples, including one of its famous castles.

Breakfast compliments the opulent setting and can be taken on the breakfast balcony. Ohh those Italian pastries are to die for.

The Theatre

The Teatro di San Carlo is located beside the Umberto Gallery. It was refurbishment in 1854 when the theatre's interior took on its traditional red and gold appearance which remains to this day. It is the oldest working theatre in Europe and well worth a visit. Either for a performance or for a tour.

On the surface it may be a city with a tattered charm yet it is set around a bay of infinite beauty dominated by mount Vesuvius.

Our commentary reminded us that the volcano just sleeps for now but should she wake again from her slumber there are detailed strategies in place for evacuation. On a more humorous note we also learnt about the legend of the castle built on an egg and other curiosities and anecdotes which these tours are famous for. We actually enjoyed two routes. One which took us around the city and one which took us along the coast high above the metropolis.

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
